

# Study on Fees Charged by Architecture and Engineering Firms in Québec 2024

## About the study

The *Study on Fees Charged by Architecture and Engineering Firms in Québec* is conducted at the request of the Secrétariat du Conseil du trésor. The objective of this study is to collect data on the fees charged for architecture and engineering services related to construction work in Québec.

The information collected will be used to produce hourly rate ranges that are representative of what is charged on the market for architecture and engineering work related to construction work.

## Mandatory participation

Your firm has been selected to take part in this study. Given the importance of the study results, the participation of your firm is mandatory in accordance with the *Act respecting the Institut de la statistique du Québec* (CQLR, chapter I-13.011).

## Confidentiality

You must provide your data to the Institut de la statistique du Québec (ISQ) as requested in this questionnaire. The ISQ guarantees that the information provided by your firm as part of this study will remain confidential.

For quality and training purposes, telephone conversations with ISQ employees are recorded. Any person who does not want their conversation to be recorded can notify the agent at the beginning of the call.

## Definitions

These definitions refer to the terms marked with an asterisk (\*) in the questionnaire.

### Architect

For the purposes of the study, architects are members of the Ordre des architectes du Québec (OAQ) practising in the private sector as well as holders of a temporary permit issued by the OAQ practising in the private sector.

### Architecture services

For architecture firms, only architecture related to construction work is concerned by the study. All other types of architecture not related to construction work are excluded (non-exhaustive examples: landscape architecture, process architecture, enterprise architecture, etc.).

### Candidate to the architectural profession

New name for intern architects.

A person holding an architectural degree from a Québec university who is a registered intern who will be completing the 3,720 mandatory hours of experience and will be taking the licensing examination.

In accordance with the *Architects Act*, a candidate must be under the supervision of an architect when performing professional activities reserved to OAQ members as a regular or contract employee.

The term “Intern Architect” will continue to be used as part of the Canadian Internship in Architecture Program (IAP).

**Candidate to the engineering profession**

An engineer who is a member of the OIQ and is enrolled in the Candidate to the Engineering Profession (CEP) program, which takes a minimum of 24 months and a maximum of 60 months to complete.

Candidates obtain their engineer title (eng.) and permit once they have successfully completed the CEP program of the OIQ.

**Drafter**

The drafters included in this study are the firm staff members working on mandates for which fees are charged for architecture and engineering services related to construction work. This category excludes staff who do administrative work.

**Engineer**

For the purposes of the study, engineers are members of the Ordre des ingénieurs du Québec (OIQ) practising in the private sector as well as holders of a temporary permit issued by the OIQ practising in the private sector.

**Engineering services**

For engineering firms, the study covers the following fields:

- Civil engineering
- Building engineering (foundations and structures, electrical and mechanical systems)
- Construction engineering

**Federal public client**

A person named by the Canadian federal government or by a federal department, together with the personnel they direct, in the exercise of the functions assigned to them by law.

**Hourly rate/fees**

For the purposes of the study, the hourly rate means the fees charged for architecture and engineering services. These fees include the firm's direct and indirect costs and its profit margin but exclude overtime and exceptional fees.

**Lead architect/engineer**

Refers to architects and engineers in a management, coordination or supervision role.

**Municipal public client**

A person named by a municipal government within the province of Québec, together with the personnel they direct, in the exercise of the functions assigned to them by law.

**Number of employees**

Number of people employed by the firm in Québec. Includes employees who, for mandates realised in Québec, telework from outside Québec.

**Performance bonus**

Individual or group performance bonus given to professional employees (engineers and architects) during the reference period from January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023.

**Private client**

For the purposes of the study, a private client is a person or a non-government company that requests the services of an architecture or consulting engineering firm for construction work carried out in Québec.

**Provincial public client**

A person named by the Québec provincial government or by a provincial ministry, together with the personnel they direct, in the exercise of the functions assigned to them by law.

**Regular weekly hours**

Number of weekly hours in a regular work week, excluding overtime.

**Technician/technologist**

The technicians and technologists included in this study are the firm staff members working on mandates for which fees are charged for architecture and engineering services related to construction work. This category excludes land survey technicians and staff who do administrative work.

For the period from January 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024, for each job classification and level of experience, what are the fees charged by your firm for consulting engineering services when carrying out **provincial public contracts**?

Regulation C-65.1, r. 12 contains the maximum hourly rates. To take direct and indirect costs and profit into account, the hourly rate for each resource is increased by a percentage of 150%.

For each occupation and level of experience, you must enter the fees (hourly rates) charged by your consulting engineering firm for the work in question, meaning the hourly rate increased by 150% (hourly rate multiplied by 2.5). In the case of work carried out for the Québec government, the hourly rates cannot exceed the maximum hourly rates set in the regulation.
